#### **Foundation Learners**

Our topic is - 'Heroes - People that help us'.

This term we will be looking at the people that help us day to day as well as the people that inspire us. We will be talking about the five emergency services and we have recreated our own 'Lixwm Emergency Services' in dosbarth Celyn. We have our own 'Teddy Bear Hospital' in Derwen and the children have been fabulous at treating the 'patients'.

We have also invited people in to the classroom to share what job they do. The adults that have come in so far have been fabulous, and inspired the children into thinking about lots of different careers.

# **Key Stage 2**

Our topic up until May half term is Around the World.

In English, we are looking at the novels Kensuke's Kingdom by Michael Morpurgo or Shackleton's Journey by William Grill. The children are enjoying the book that their group are reading and we have very much up to crucial parts in both books! We are in the middle of writing our own journey stories at the moment and the children are doing a brilliant job of showing off what they have learnt whilst studying this writing genre.

We have just started looking at magnetism in our topic work and we have been starting to create shared Jamboards this week about our knowledge, thoughts and theories around how magnets work, magnetic fields and what it effects on Earth.

In RE we have been looking at which of the major religions have a creation story within their Holy Book. We have also looked at the scientific theory of creation and we will be using this knowledge to create our own worlds with our own beliefs about how it was created next week.

PE/outdoor learning will continue to be on a Friday afternoon. This is a mixture of PE, Forest School with Mrs O'Neill, and gardening, which we have had great success with over the part few weeks. We have nearly finished measuring and marking out the raised beds, the first batch of radish are out, and we have planted pumpkins, tomatoes, cucumbers, lettuce, a herb garden, and sweetcorn.

PE will now be on a Friday afternoon. Can pupils come ready in their PE kit. Forest Schools will continue every other Friday with Mrs O'Neill and the children will be using the fire to cook recipes from around the world.

# **Criw Cymraeg**

Criw Cymraeg spent the Spring term reviewing our Welsh provision across school and as part of this they carried out a learning walk around the school and asked children in Blwyddyn 2-6 to complete a questionnaire. The findings from their learning walk showed lots of positive outcomes including a variety of Welsh language patterns on displays around school, staff using Welsh in classes and around school, children confidently responding to Welsh questions from staff or Criw Cymraeg, Welsh signage around school and children completing their registers, prayers and asking for things in Welsh. They also gave some excellent feedback from their questionnaire results which showed that the children had

scored highly for things including "I think that learning and speaking Welsh is important", "I enjoy learning and speaking Welsh", "I enjoy taking part in Welsh activities", "I see Welsh displayed around school" and "I hear Welsh in assembly".

After reviewing their findings, targets they have identified for this term include focusing on increasing the amount of Welsh reading we do in class and our use of Welsh books, our use of Welsh apps for enjoyment across the school and encouraging further use of Welsh outside the classroom including at lunchtime and events such as Sports Day.

They will update everyone further towards the end of the Summer term.
