

## Criw Cymraeg Autumn/Hydref 1 half-term update



Helo! We have had a busy half term in school so far. As with every new academic year, we spent the first few weeks settling back in and applying for roles within the School Council/Eco-Committee and Criw Cymraeg. Once our Criw Cymraeg members for the 2024-2025 year had been chosen, we appointed our Chair and spent our initial meetings discussing what we felt had been done well last year and deciding upon our aims for the academic year.



We are working towards the Gwobr Arian / Silver Award for Cymraeg Campus as we already have the Gwobr Efydd / Bronze Award.

- Our first task was to share the Holiadur / Questionnaire with everyone in Blwyddyn 2-6. This is completed at the start and end of every year to show us how all the children feel about Welsh in our school and to give us key areas to focus on for the academic year, alongside the Cymraeg Campus Arian Targets.
- We set up our Criw Cymraeg weekly assemblies, giving out roles to each of our Criw Cymraeg members.
- We introduced and learnt two new Welsh songs together in our weekly Welsh assemblies to add to our assembly repertoire.
- We celebrated Diwrnod Su'mae as a school by learning about it and playing some Welsh language games in our weekly Welsh assemblies, and then dressing in red, white and green for the day and doing some craft work to make Welsh greeting posters for around school.
- We planned our Harvest festival service which we celebrated in the Chapel in Lixwm, including a new Welsh song that we learnt especially called 'Diolch Iesu'
- We also decided to focus on our House names as a theme for some of our learning and projects about Wales during this year, kicking it off with four assemblies learning about Owain Glyndwr. Foundation class continued their learning in class by doing some drawing and writing, learning a Welsh Talk 4 Writing script about him and spending a morning in the outdoor provision demonstrating what they had learnt.

We are looking forward to the Autumn 2 half-term and making more progress towards our targets.
