This term, our Foundation learners will be exploring the topic '**Where the Wild Things Are**', inspired by the well-known story by Maurice Sendak. The children will enjoy retelling the tale of Max and his adventure, as well as developing their own creative writing skills by creating stories of their own.

We will take inspiration from the 'wild things' in the story to learn about animals and their habitats, and we will investigate different materials to discover which are best for building a boat that floats. In our expressive arts sessions, the children will create and perform their own 'rumpus' dance.

School Lunches – Reception to Year 6 Pupils

You are now able to order your child's/children's school dinner up to three weeks in advance on the School Gateway App. Parents are unable to order for their child on the App on the day. If it is a whole school trip then the only option available to you on that day will be packed lunches. If, however, it is just a year group then packed lunch will have to be ordered by notifying school by text or email. If your child is going to be late in, please ensure that you let us know before 9.30am. If you have pre-ordered and your child is absent from school, we will remove the dinner for that day.
